These competitions are held over four consecutive weeks throughout the year. Participants must play with the same partner at least three times over the four weeks to be eligible.

The pair with the highest aggregate percentage score from any three sessions out of the four will win.

GNOT QUALIFYING ROUNDS

An opportunity for members to earn gold points in a club competition.

ALAN CREVALD MOST IMPROVED PLAYER

This is awarded annually to the member who begins the year with less than 25 Masterpoints and is the most improved player according to the ABF Most Improved Player report as at the 31st December each year.

CHRISTMAS RED POINT FESTIVAL

All players have a chance to win red points - no qualifying necessary.

CODE OF CONDUCT

All Club bridge events are run within the framework of Laws of Bridge which are shared with the state, national and international community. The same set of laws apply worldwide. In the midst of the predominantly technical laws there is Law 74A which says:

"Players should always be courteous and carefully avoid any remark or extraneous action that might cause annoyance or embarrassment to another player or might interfere with the enjoyment of the game".

From this can be seen that good behaviour at the table is not a preference, it is a requirement.

To be consistent with other clubs, MBC has adopted a Players Code of Conduct which requires all players to:

- · Be polite and courteous at all times
- Respect other people's rights to have different opinions or ways of thinking
- Conduct their game in a proper, mature and inoffensive manner
- Show patience and understanding with new members and visitors

In upholding the intentions of this Law, MBC (Mandurah Bridge Club) has zero tolerance for rudeness, harassment, unwelcome physical contact, and intentional or unintentional discriminatory and offensive behaviour whether it relates to gender, ethnicity or religion or could be regarded as sexually suggestive.

More modest offences such as demeaning remarks about opponents' or partner's play or bidding, giving gratuitous advice at the table, arguing with the Director or being generally ungracious are also regarded as unacceptable.

If you believe that you have been on the receiving end of poor behaviour, you must call the Director immediately. The Director is empowered to assess the evidence and take a range of actions ranging from requiring an immediate apology, issuing a warning or awarding a penalty which will affect the offenders' score for the session.

Significant breaches of the law will be referred to the Club Recorder for further investigation. You also have access to this same Recorder if you believe that any complaint by you or about you has not been dealt with fairly.

Our membership group is wonderfully diverse. Always show the same respect to others that you would like to receive yourself and remember that your concept of what is correct to say and how it is said can be viewed by others from a different perspective.

NOTES FOR PLAYERS

GENERAL POINTS

- A neat standard of dress and personal hygiene is required.
- Members are encouraged to wear their name badges.
- All partnerships playing other than the basic ACOL or Standard American systems are required to have a current System Card at all sessions. This requirement was introduced to ensure fairness for all players in both our regular and red point sessions.
- Air conditioning and heating will be used during play at the discretion of the Director. Members to dress accordingly.
- All games will start promptly at advertised times and players should be seated fifteen minutes before the scheduled start time to allow the Director time to decide the movement and allocate boards to each table. Players arriving later than this may be denied the opportunity to play. Play may only start when the Director instructs players to do so.
- Please give the Director your attention and follow instructions promptly.
- . Smoking is not permitted within 5 metres of the building.

PROCEDURE & ETIQUETTE

- Greet your opponents with a smile when they join your table.
- · Count your cards before looking at them.
- Adopt a consistent style and tempo with your bids and play.
- No information should be conveyed to your partner during bidding or play by way of gestures, mannerisms or hesitations.
- When making an opening lead, place your card face down first.
- Agree on the number of tricks made or lost before shuffling your cards together at the end of play.
- Do not discuss the hands until the round has ended. Any discussion should be done quietly and care must be taken to ensure that no information about the hand can be overheard by an adjoining table. Failure to comply can result in a procedural penalty being awarded against the offenders.
- If the lead for the final board to be played has not been completed by the time the 2 minute warning bell sounds, the Director will award an adjusted score.

CALLING THE DIRECTOR

- Call the Director whenever an irregularity has occurred or is thought to have occurred
- Do not touch the cards or take any other action until the Director arrives at your table.
- · Accept the Director's ruling with grace.
- Inform the Director if you consider the ruling to be incorrect or unfair. Appeals against a Director's decision must be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the day's play.
- It is courteous to call the Director with the words, "<u>Director</u> Please".
- If a member believes that an error has occurred in the scoring of an event, then an email setting out details of the error is to be sent to the Tournament Manager. Alternatively, members may discuss the matter with the Director within 24 hours of completion of play.

DISPUTES

All disputes are to be referred to the Tournament Director who will ensure they are dealt with according to the procedures laid down by the Bridge Association of Western Australia.

CLUB RECORDERS

The purpose and role of the Recorder is that of "unofficial" mediator. The Club Recorder is available for the Club members who feel that a breach of ethics or propriety has occurred and deals with issues unrelated to the laws of bridge.

The Club Recorder is not the only avenue available to discuss any concerns a member may have. The Director of the day can be approached to discuss the issue and the Director may suggest the member contact the Club Recorder.

Depending upon the circumstances, the Club Recorder will talk to the offending party and, hopefully, a simple resolution will occur. Where circumstances are more serious, the offending party may be warned not to continue certain behaviour. The Club Recorder will refer unresolved issues to the Disciplinary Panel.

The Club Recorder maintains a log of all incidents in the Club Recorders' Book. The log is confidential and is not shared with anyone, including the Management Committee.

Bridge is an ethical game. While everyone wants to win, we also play bridge for fun, particularly at Club level. Therefore, anyone playing at the Club should be able to do so without being intimidated, bullied or cheated in any way.

Whilst such incidences are rare, they do occur and to acknowledge this, our Club, like many others, has now created this position.

GRIEVANCES POLICY

Any grievance that a member/s may have regarding the behaviour of another member/s is to firstly be referred to a Recorder of the member's choice who will, for first 'offences', offer to speak to the offending member/s to hopefully resolve the issue by way of apology or other action acceptable to the member.

Unless the Recorder is completely satisfied that the complaint is without foundation, details of the complaint and resolution are to be recorded in the Official Recorders' Record book that is maintained jointly by all Recorders

Disputes Procedure

 Resolvable complaints are to be dealt with in accordance with Paragraphs 1 & 2 of this Grievance Policy.

- Non-Resolvable complaints are to be referred to a Disciplinary Panel (See below) for resolution.
- The Recorder/s have the discretion to report repeated complaints to the Management Committee and request the formation of a Disciplinary Panel.

Disciplinary Panel

- The Disciplinary Panel will be an ad hoc sub-committee of the Management Committee with delegated powers and authority consistent with the Mandurah Bridge Club (Inc.) Rules 2021 and cognisant of the principles of procedural fairness. It will be required to report to the Management Committee immediately in a format determined by the Management Committee.
- The Disciplinary Panel will consist of the 'Chairperson' (See description), 4 members (See description), Recorder/s and Secretary. The four members will be randomly selected by the Chairperson if a meeting is to be convened. A member will be ineligible to sit on the panel if there is a perceived conflict of interest or he/she has prior knowledge of the matters under consideration
- Description of the 'Chairperson' President, (Vice President or Life Member in the absence of the President).
- Description of 'Members'. All members in the pool are to be financial, nominated and/or 'voluntary'.
- Only the Chairperson and the four 'selected' pool members have voting rights.
- No sitting member of the Management Committee other than the Chairperson, is eligible to sit on the Disciplinary Panel.
- The Disciplinary Panel to be responsible only for behaviour issues.
 Directors are responsible for all procedural penalties for such matters as slow play, lateness, violation of rules of bridge, etc.
- Penalties for offences be on a scale of highest expulsion, suspension, public apology for behaviour, formal warning – lowest.
